CHSS 2020 SCHOLARSHIP & BURSARY APPLICATION PROCEDURE

The CHSS 2020 Scholarship & Bursary Booklet will be available online at <http://sd52.bc.ca/chss/> under "Grad info" by **May 10, 2020**. It is designed to present the financial awards made available by a number of Prince Rupert organizations and service clubs to graduating students who are planning to attend a post- secondary institution.

These organizations are to be **thanked** for their generosity and for their recognition of the real need that exists for all students who embark on further education.

The financial awards described in this booklet are listed alphabetically and are classified as awards, bursaries and bursaries.

Awards: presented upon fulfilment of specific criteria as outlined in each award description.

Bursaries: presented on the basis of fulfilment of criteria and demonstrated financial need.

Scholarships: presented on the basis of academic achievement or combined academic, athletic and citizenship

How to Apply

1) All students wanting to be considered for awards must fill out an application form and include a personal essay. An attached reference letter would also be useful.

The personal essay will include the following:

- i. introduce yourself
- ii. Explain your post-secondary plans (where you are going, what you plan to study
- iii. Summarize you interests, activities, involvements, accomplishments
- iv. Comment on any financial need you may have, if appropriate. For example, a single parent family with other siblings attending post-secondary school
- v. Closing comments thanking the committee for considering your application.

The personal essay should be **one to two pages maximum** in length and gives the donor a snapshot of who you are.

2) Once you have your application and essay ready, we would like you to make copies for the organizations you are applying to. Read the criteria carefully. **Please make sure you contact Ms. Bryant or Ms. Offutt to find out where to drop of your applications.** Due to the COVID-19 social distancing protocol we will we let you know the process.

3) Deadline for application is **May 19, 2020**

4) Scholarship, bursary and award recipients will be determined by the Scholarships and Awards Committee or some organizations will choose their recipients and notify the school.

General Criteria (Given the current situation we have condensed the awards booklet and all awards require that you meet the following criteria

- 1) Must be a graduate of Charles Hays Secondary
- 2) Must be enrolled in a post-secondary institution
- 3) Must provide proof of confirmation of acceptance (include if you have received, in some cases you may be taking a year off before attending post-secondary.
- 4) Scholarships, bursaries and awards must be used within 24 months unless otherwise specified.

Please note some awards, bursaries, and scholarships have additional criteria and application procedures.

NOTE: At the time of posting due to the COVID-19 pandemic some of the awards have not yet been confirmed and may not be available this year.

Aboriginal Education Scholarship

Aboriginal Education Council of School District #52 will provide two scholarships to Aboriginal graduates pursuing a full-time program at a post-secondary institution. Scholarship must be used within in 12 months of graduation.

Amount: 2 X \$500.00

Adam Moore Memorial Bursary

The Friendship House on behalf of Prince Rupert Grain and his father, Lance Clark, will provide a bursary in memory of Adam Moore.

Amount: \$300.00

AFFNO Bursary

AFFNO will provide a bursary to a French Immersion graduate. Applicants must write a letter **IN FRENCH** (approx. 200-400 words) outlining what French Immersion has meant to them, what they plan do with French in the future, and what they would use the bursary for.

Deadline is May 19th

Please note the letter can be sent via email, as long as a) it is directly in the email, and b) you put BURSARY in the subject line. Include your name, address, and other contact information.

All Native Tournament-Jim Ciccone Memorial Bursary

The All Native Tournament with assistance from other organizations will provide a bursary to a student of First Nations ancestry. Applicants should demonstrate ability in the areas of academics, athletics and citizenship. Awards must be used within 15 months of graduation.

Amount: \$500.00

Area A Crab Association

The Area A Crab Association will provide a bursary to a dependent of members of the Association.

Amount: 2 X \$1000.00

Bob Quast Memorial Bursary

The Bob Quast Memorial Award has been established to provide an award annually to a successful candidate. Applicants may be enrolled in an emergency series academy. Applicants must have achieved a C+ or higher in every grade 11 & 12 course in which they were enrolled (candidates for this

award are disqualified if they have dropped any grade 11 or 12 course more than halfway through its completion). Important consideration will be given to applicants who are dedicated to at least **one** extracurricular activity, display excellent citizenship at the school or community level, and have an exemplary attendance and punctuality record. Bursary must be used within 24 months of graduation.

Amount: \$750.00

C.U.P.E. Local 105 Bursary

Canadian Union of Public Employees, Local 105 will provide bursaries to applicants who are a son, daughter or legal ward of a CUPE Local 105 (Municipal), Local 105-1 (Library), Local 105-2 (District of Port Edward), Local 105-3 (Village of Masset), Local 105-4 (Skeena Queen Charlotte Regional District) or Local 105-5 (Golf Course Society member). Bursaries must be used within 36 months of graduation.

Eligible applicants must also fill out an additional CUPE application form at the back of this booklet.

Amount: \$250.00- \$500.00

Canadian Fishing Company Scholarship

The Canadian Fishing Company will be providing scholarships to graduating students. Preference will be given to family members of fishermen or employees of the Canadian Fishing Company Ltd (fishermen, plant employees, tender men or salaried staff). Scholarships must be used within 18 months of graduation.

Amount: \$500.00 - \$1000.00

Canadian National Railway Pacific Division North Scholarship

Established in December 2002 and administered by the N.W. Education '88' Foundation). The Foundation will provide a maximum of two scholarships to graduating students. One child per family per year may be the recipient.

Amount: 2 X \$500.00

Canadian Parents for French Bursary

Canadian Parents for French-Prince Rupert Chapter (CPF-PRC) will provide bursaries for graduating French Immersion students who have successfully completed Core French 12. Applicants must currently be a member or a dependent of a current member of Canadian Parents for French. To join CPF (\$25/yr.) please go to cpf.ca.

Eligible applicants must also provide a cover letter, IN FRENCH, stating why you should be considered for a bursary.

A bursary has been established in memory of Chris McIntosh, a long-time teacher at King Edward and Lax Kxeen. After retirement she continued to tutor in Mrs. White's class at Lax Kxeen. Preference will be given to a former student of Mrs. White.

Amount: \$250.00

CHSS Directors Choice Theatre Bursary

A bursary will be given to an applicant who has participated in theatre throughout his/her high school career both in and out of the classroom. Preference will be given to applicants who have taken one or more of the following courses:

- Drama 10
- Theatre Performance 11 and/or 12
- Directing & Scriptwriting 12
- Peer Tutoring (in a drama class)
- Musical Theatre Performance or Production

The selected student will have participated in two or more of the following: The school musical/major fall production, drama festival, fine arts revue, and/or community theatre. Award must be used within 24 months of graduation.

Amount: \$500.00

CHSS Parent Advisory Committee Bursary

The Charles Secondary School Parent Advisory Committee will provide 4 bursaries to graduating students. Bursaries must be used within 24 months of graduation.

Amount: 4 X \$600.00

CityWest Scholarships

CityWest will provide two scholarship, the Eric Janes Scholarship awarded to the top academic student and CityWest Scholarship awarded to deserving student who is going into the field of Information Technology or Telecommunications.

Amount: \$1500.00 (Eric Janes) and \$750.00 (CityWest)

Conner Carter Memorial Bursary

Connor Carter was a student at Charles Hays Secondary School. A bursary will be given in his memory to a graduating student. Preference will be given to a student who is planning on becoming a Special Education Teacher or enrolling in a program in the helping field.

Amount: \$500.00

Dong Sing Memorial Bursary

A bursary has been established in memory of Dong Sing and will be awarded to a deserving graduate.

Amount: \$300.00

DP World Holding Corp. Scholarship

DP World Holding Corp will provide two in scholarships to graduating students. First preference will be given to the candidate/candidates who are the daughters or sons of an employee of DP World Holding Corp or of ILWU Prince Rupert Long Shore Local 505 or 514. If only one applicant qualifies, they will receive \$2000.

Amount: 2 X \$1000.00

Filipino Canadian Association Award

The Filipino Canadian Association of Prince Rupert will provide to graduating student or students (divided equally if more than one is eligible). Preference will be given to the son, daughter, or dependent of a member in good standing and active in the association and with the residency of three consecutive years. Award must be used within 12 months of graduation.

Amount: \$1000.00

Forest Renewal BC Bursary

Forest Renewal BC will provide bursaries to applicants who are enrolled in the field of forestry, environment, or wood design at a post-secondary institution. Applicants must have demonstrated their interest in forest management or the environment through community activities, nature clubs, woodwork, or participation in forest-related classes.

Amount: Up to \$800.00

Fran Tanaka Bursary

The Fran Tanaka Bursary will provide a bursary to a graduating student. Preference will be given to applicants that are pursuing a career in the field of sciences. Bursary must be used within eighteen months of graduation.

Amount: \$500.00

Frank Amante Memorial Bursary

The Frank Amante Memorial Bursary will provide a bursary to a graduating student who furthers him or herself in mechanical trades or post-secondary education. Preference will be given to applicants entering the mechanical trades.

Amount: \$250.00

Friendship House Assoc. - R. W. K. Elliot Bursary

The R.W.K. Elliott Fund was established to provide one bursary to a graduating student. Applicants must take post-secondary studies in the Social Services area.

Amount: \$200.00

Galaxy Gardens Restaurant Scholarship

The Galaxy Gardens Restaurant will provide a scholarship to a graduating student. Applicants must be enrolled in a post-secondary education institution in B.C. Please note: \$250.00 will be available at the start of the first year of study and a second \$250.00 will be made available for the second term of study.

Amount: \$500.00

George William Jeffery Memorial Scholarship

The Jeffrey family will provide a scholarship to applicants who are of First Nations ancestry and a member of the Lax Kw'alaams or Metlakatla Band. Preference will be given to applicants pursuing law, medicine, or education. This Scholarship must be used within 12 months of graduation.

Eligible applicants must also provide a short letter outlining their commitment to the field they will be pursuing (either law, medicine or education).

Amount: \$1000.00

Gingolx Education Department Bursary

The Gingolx Village Government Education Department will provide a bursary to a graduating student who is of First Nations ancestry and a member of the Kincolith Band. Applicants must provide a copy of their latest report card, a letter of intent (explaining what their educational endeavors are) and a reference letter from the school. Bursary must be used within 12 months of graduation.

Amount: \$500.00

Gitmaxmak'ay Bursary

The Gitmaxmak'ay Nisga'a Society will provide four bursaries to graduating students (CHSS OR PCS). Applicants must be a registered Nisga'a citizen in the Gitmaxmak'ay District (with proof of citizenship number). Applicant must be

going to a post-secondary institution in September. Bursary must be used within 24 months of graduation. Confirmation of enrollment for a minimum 30 days is required before monies will be distributed.

Eligible applicants must also provide a cover letter outlining why they should be considered for a bursary.

Grad Parent Committee Bursary

The Grad Parent Committee will provide four bursaries to graduating students. Applicants must have demonstrated good grades and attendance

Eligible applicants must also provide a brief essay outlining what the applicant's plans are for schooling and a statement of goals.

Grain Workers Union - Local 333 Bursary

The Grain Workers Union Local 333 Prince Rupert will provide bursaries to graduating students. Applicants must be dependent children covered under the health and benefit plan of Local 333 Prince Rupert members.

Amount: \$500.00

Harris and Company Law Award

The Harris and Company provides a \$250 award to the top Law 12 student.

Amount: \$250.00

Healthy Choices Bursary

The Prince Rupert Sikh Missionary Society will provide two awards to graduating students who have made the decision to be drug, tobacco and alcohol free during their high school.

The smart and healthy choice to avoid the use of illegal substances, focus on academics and healthy school and community activities is a choice worthy of commendation. Applicants must have not used alcohol, tobacco or illegal drugs during their lifetime and list in detail specific drug prevention activities you have been involved in and list your extracurricular activities both in school and in your community.

Eligible applicants must also provide a one-page essay (type written and double spaced) that describes specifically how you have lived and modeled a drug free life; why you made the choice to be alcohol and drug free; and what role youth can play in drug free prevention efforts. Applicants must fill out an additional application form at the back of this booklet.

Amount: 2 X \$500.00

Hospital Employees Union Award

The Prince Rupert Local of the Hospital Employee's Union will provide a bursary to a graduating student. First Preference will be given to dependents of H.E.U. members. No second-generation applications accepted unless the student is a direct dependant of the second generation HEU member. If no dependant applies, then graduating students entering post-Secondary field of Healthcare training will be considered. Bursary must be used within 24 months of graduation.

Amount: \$500.00

Indo-Canadian Sikh Association Scholarship

The Indo-Canadian Sikh Association of Prince Rupert will provide a scholarship to a graduating student. Preference will be given to applicants who have exhibited good citizenship within both the school and the Prince Rupert community.

Amount: \$500.00

International Longshore Union- Thomas Pilfold Memorial Bursary

The Thomas Pilfold Memorial Bursary was established by the members of the International Longshore and Warehouse Union (ILWU) Local 505, will be providing bursaries to graduating students. **First preference will be given to dependent children covered under the Health and Benefit plan of Local 505 members. Second preference will be given to grandchildren of Local 505 members.** If no dependents apply, then it will be open to all students.

Amount: 2 X \$1000.00

* Payment of the bursary will be made in two equal installments, one in September, the second in January, upon confirmation of enrollment and entrance in a post-secondary institution.

Islander Hall Society Bursary

The Islander Hall Society (Pulp and Paper and Woodworkers of Canada Local 4) will be providing 6 bursaries to graduating students. Three bursaries will be awarded to students going into the trades and three will be awarded to students going into some aspect of the medical field. Preference will be given to the applicants who are the daughter or son, stepdaughter or stepson, brother or

sister, niece or nephew, or grandchild of a Watson Island Pulp and Paper and Woodworkers of Canada Local 4 member. Bursary must be used with 18 months of graduation.

Amount: 6 X \$1000.00

Seafest Jim Ciccone Memorial 3on3 Basketball Challenge Bursary

The Prince Rupert Special Events Society will provide one bursary to a graduating student in memory of Jim Ciccone's contribution of volunteering in the community. The bursary is available as the result of the Jim Ciccone Memorial 3on3 Basketball Challenge that is held annually during the Seafest community festival. The Jim Ciccone Civic Centre was named in his memory in 1996 in recognition to his long and outstanding service to recreation, his service as an elected alderman (City Councillor), as a director on the board of the All Native Basketball Tournament, and his many fine achievements as a homegrown athlete and coach. Jim Ciccone was born in Prince Rupert in 1952 and graduated from Prince Rupert Secondary School. He received provincial honours as a basketball player for the Rainmakers and went on to play basketball for the Simon Fraser Clansmen. Preference is given to applicants who were either an active player of a senior Charles Hays Secondary School basketball team during grades 10, 11 or 12 or they must be an active player of a City of Prince Rupert basketball league in their graduating year. The applicant **must** have also volunteered in the previous 12 months at a minimum of two (2) community festivals organized by the Prince Rupert Special Events Society. Bursary must be used within 16 months of graduation.

Eligible applicants must also provide a paragraph and include it with their application, expressing what basketball has meant to them, what their most memorable game was and why, and also why they would like to receive this bursary.

Johal and Associates Professional Chartered Accountant Scholarship

The accounting firm of Johal & Associates, Certified General Accountant will provide one scholarship to a graduating student.

Eligible applicants must also provide an Essay must be written, minimum of 250 maximum 750 words, outlining the students' community involvement, involvement in volunteer organization, involvement in clubs or what they have done to make our community better. It could also include how, with their further education, they would give back to the community.

Amount: \$1000.00

Knights of Columbus, Council 5282 Bursary

Knights of Columbus Council 5282 wish to advise that they will award two bursaries to the graduating students. Preference will be given based on evidence of service to local community, families of the Knights of Columbus in good standing, members of the Annunciation Parish, Prince Rupert.

Eligible applicants must also provide a 300-word essay outlining personal career goals and two personal references (including at least one teacher).

Kream Come True has generously donated a bursary to a graduate who is part of or an ally of the LGBTQ community. In addition, the applicant should demonstrate leadership skills in regard to equality and advocating for LGBTQ rights.

Ladies of the Royal Purple Bursary

The Ladies of the Royal Purple of Canada Lodge #8 - Prince Rupert will provide bursaries to graduating students. Bursaries must be used within 12 months of graduation.

Amount: 3 X \$1000.00

Lazy Cat Closet Bursary

Lazy Cat Closet will generously provide a bursary for a graduating student who is interested in studying fashion design and shows an interest in a future in sustainable fabrics, small batch, slow fashion with an emphasis on made in B.C. or made in Canada.

Amount: \$500.00

Lucas Anders Legacy Award

The Lucas Anders Legacy Award is presented to commemorate the work and volunteerism of former Prince Rupert radio host Lucas Anders, who from 2014-2016 worked in the city as a morning disc jockey and occasional teacher-on-call with School District 52. As well, he performed with Harbour Theatre Society (founding an improvisational comedy troupe), participated in curling and hockey leagues, and sharpened his public speaking skills as a member of the Prince Rupert Toastmasters Club.

Following his departure from Prince Rupert, a friend and frequent collaborator created this award to benefit high school graduates with similar commitment to community- enriching volunteer activity- and the intent to follow Lucas into the field of broadcasting.

During his teacher-on-call assignments, Lucas inspired students at local elementary schools, Prince Rupert Middle School, and Charles Hays Secondary School. Therefore, this award will be offered for twelve years (2017-2028 inclusive), until the last Prince Rupert to Port Edward students who knew "Mr. Anders" have graduated.

Applications must be attending a television, radio or other specialized broadcasting program at a recognized university, college, or technical school. If there are no suitable candidates pursuing post-secondary broadcast training, then graduates are applying to the Faculty of Education at a recognized university or college are also eligible for this award. Applicants must display excellent citizenship at the school and/or community level and be strongly dedicated to at least one extracurricular activity.

Eligible applicants must also provide a 500-word essay or five-minute (maximum) multimedia work is required, on the subject of how media can enrich communities. The award sponsor reserves the right to publish any applicant's essay or multimedia work in the service of publicizing the Lucas Anders Legacy Award.

Amount: \$1000.00

Luso Portuguese Club Scholarship

The Luso Portuguese Club will provide a scholarship to a graduating student. Preference will be given to the son, daughter or dependent of a member in good standing with the club. Applicants must have exhibited good citizenship within both the school and the Prince Rupert community. Scholarship must be used within 12 years of graduation.

Amount: \$500.00

Maureen (McLean) & Lothar Kiner Scholarship

Maureen and Lothar Kiner, alumni of Prince Rupert Secondary School will provide two scholarships to graduation students. Scholarship must be used within 12 months of graduation.

Amount: 2 X \$3000.00

Melvin Martin Holkestad Memorial Bursary

The Melvin Martin Holkestad Memorial Bursary has been established in the memory of Mr. Melvin Martin Holkestad. Preference will be given to applicants pursuing sciences. Bursary must be used within 12 months of graduation.

Amount: \$1000.00

Metlakatla Development Corporation

Metlakatla Development Corporation will provide one scholarship to a graduating student of First Nations ancestry and a member of the Metlakatla Band. Scholarship must be used within 12 months of graduation.

Amount: \$500.00

Michael Lemon Memorial Basketball Scholarship

Michael Lemon was a Rainmaker during the years of 1958-1910, he passed away on January 4th, 2019. As a former Rainmaker it would have been important to Michael to provide an opportunity for someone currently playing the sport like he loved and choosing to take their education further, whether through University, College, or Trade School. Scholarships will be provided to both one male and one female student from the Prince Rupert Rainmakers Basketball team. Applicants must have shown strong leadership qualities through active community involvement of school activities. Scholarships must be used within 24 months of graduation.

Amount: 2 X \$1000.00

Nadia Movold Bursary

Nadia Movold will generously provide a bursary to a graduating student. Bursary must be used within 6 months of graduation.

Amount: \$500.00

North Coast Artist's Cooperative Bursary

The Artists Co-op bursary established in 2008.
